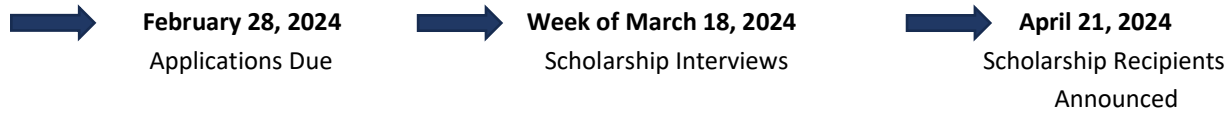
Leadership Scholarship Eligibility Criteria

Current Washburn University students must have a cumulative college GPA of 3.0.

Leadership Scholarship Participation Requirements

Accepting a leadership scholarship commits a student to participate in Washburn University's Leadership Institute and is more than an award-based scholarship. Annual renewal of a leadership scholarship is contingent upon maintaining a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0, making appropriate annual progress toward the Leadership Studies Minor or Certificate, and meeting performance and program participation criteria as determined by the Director of the Leadership Institute.

What items to submit.

All items must be received to complete your application to be considered for a leadership scholarship.

- 1. Questions**—Submit your typed answers to the following questions. All questions need to be answered. Thoroughly and well-written responses are more important than length of responses (approximately 300-500 words).
 1. Describe your previous and current involvement with the Leadership Institute. If you have not been previously involved, please explain why.
 2. As part of the Leadership Institute, what do you hope to accomplish? What specific programs or initiatives are you interested in. (Visit www.washburn.edu/leadership for more information.)
 3. What are your life goals beyond your major and graduation and how does leadership play a part in them. Please use what you have learned about leadership so far as a basis for your answer.
- 2. Resume** — your resume should highlight the following areas during your tenure at Washburn University
 - * Organizational membership and Leadership Roles
 - * Awards Received
 - * Community Service
 - * Work Experience
- 3. Letter of Recommendation**—This person should not be faculty or staff of the Leadership Institute. It should be forwarded to the Leadership Institute prior to or postmarked by February 28, 2024.

- 4. Letter of recommendation**

(Applications and supporting documents postmarked later than **February 28, 2024**, cannot be guaranteed a review. Even if we can review late submissions, they will almost certainly be at a competitive disadvantage in the review process.)
