

2012 AP German Language Summer Institute Syllabus July 23 – 26, 2012

Institute Overview

This is the year to visit an AP Summer Institute for German! Our new exam will be given for the first time in the spring of 2012 and there are many changes from the previous one. We will also have student samples of the exams for the first time. This is very important so you know how to prepare your students. In this institute, participants will learn how the new exam is constructed and how best to prepare for it. Participants will also be assisted in revamping their syllabi for the new AP audit, will work on already prepared units for the classroom, and practice developing their own materials. This institute will definitely give you and your students an edge in preparing for the new AP German Language and Culture Exam.

Consultant Background



Beth Smith has been teaching German since 1969 and has been teaching AP German since 1991 at Plano Senior High School. After graduating with a BA in Modern Language from Kansas State University, she received her MA in German Education from the University of Kansas. She has served as table leader and a question leader for the AP reading and has been presenting workshops on the teaching of AP German as a College Board consultant since 1993. She co-authored a workshop for the College Board on Vertical Teaming in the Language classroom and has collaborated on a book published by the College Board to prepare students for the exam. She is a reviewer of materials on the website, AP Central, and has contributed to focus materials on reading and writing for the College Board. She worked with the College Board on materials for use in workshops to train teachers for the new AP Exam. As past president of the American Association of Teachers of German, she has had the opportunity to work with the latest materials and pedagogy. She was honored by the AATG as National German Educator of the Year at the Secondary Level in 2006.

Institute Schedule

Monday

Introduction of the new AP German Language and Culture framework and test.
Interpretive Communication: test, framework, thematic units, authentic material.

Tuesday

Interpersonal Communication: We will discuss this year's questions and practice grading the samples from this year's exam. We will discuss ways to develop better interpersonal skills in the classroom. We will also work on developing materials to practice the written and spoken interpersonal portions of the exam.

Wednesday

Written Presentational Communication: We will discuss this year's question and practice grading the samples from this year's exam. We will discuss ways to not only teach better writing skills, but ways to grade more writing without being overwhelmed. We will work on developing the vocabulary and techniques to help the students handle the new writing challenges.

Thursday

Oral Presentational Communication: We will discuss this year's question and practice grading the samples from the exam. We will work on ways of preparing students for the new exam by emphasizing vertical development and scaffolding. Participants will share thematic units they have developed during the workshop.
