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



ABOUT THE PROGRAM

- Your admission: To be admitted to the RN-to-BSN program, you must have a 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale and possess an active, unencumbered RN license, or be eligible to obtain one, in your state of residence.
- Your courses: Classes are exclusively online and adhere to Quality Matters Standards for the design of online courses. You will take courses taught in eight-week sessions with a minimum of a one-week break.
- Transfer credits: A minimum of 120 credit hours is required for a bachelor's degree. You can transfer up to 92 credit hours into the program. You will earn 32 credit hours in the RN-to-BSN program.
- When you can start: Washburn has start dates available at various times throughout the year. Visit our website at washburn.edu/rn-bsn for information on course start dates, as well as deadlines for applications, documents, registration and tuition payments.
