Join the Washburn Alumni Association and spend the weekend with fellow Ichabods and friends tasting wine along the Hermann, Missouri Wine Trail. Before Prohibition, Hermann and the surrounding area produced more than one million gallons of wine a year and were home to the nation's second largest winery. Today Hermann-area winemakers are once again producing award-winning wines.

Winding through some of the prettiest scenery in Missouri, the Hermann Wine Trail meanders for some 20+ miles along the Missouri River between Hermann, New Haven and beyond. Nestled along the trail are several charming family-owned wineries and microbreweries.

Board our private motorcoach, sit back and enjoy the ride to Missouri. We'll leave the Washburn campus at 5 p.m. and stop briefly in Kansas City to pick up some KC area alumni and friends, then drive to Washington, Missouri and check into our hotel. Saturday and Sunday will be filled with tasting wine, beer and sausage in Augusta, New Haven, Hermann and Swiss, Missouri.
