4. **All nomination materials must be bound together with a paperclip.** This includes nomination application, nomination letter, and any supporting materials.
5. **One (1) copy** of the nomination application, nomination letter, and any supporting materials must be submitted to Student Activities & Greek Life **by 5:00 pm on Friday, March 2, 2018**
6. Nominations will be judged on the following criteria:

 - f. Membership recruitment

 - b. Describe methods nominee uses to train leaders and/or members.
 - c. What outstanding qualities does this person exhibit as an organizational advisor?

Guidelines:

- 1. Programs presented by any Student Activities & Greek Life registered student organization shall be eligible for nomination. Registered student organizations can nominate programs in the four separate categories as follows:
Community Service - organizing, participating in, or developing a program to perform volunteer work for your community that improves the quality of life
Campus Enhancement - a program designed to improve students' WU experience, raise school spirit, or promote the image and assets of Washburn
Diversity - a program designed to promote awareness or understanding of race, ethnicity, gender, economic status, language, religion, ability, age, or sexual orientation
Education - a program tending or intending to educate, instruct, or inform
Co-sponsored events shall be eligible for consideration as long as all sponsoring parties are registered student organizations.
2. Nominations may be submitted by an individual (faculty, staff or student) or by a registered student organization.
3. Nominations must be typed and be no longer than four (4) pages in length.
4. Nomination letter may also be accompanied by supporting materials (promotion, goals, attendance/service reports, etc.) for the selection committee to use to better understand program's purpose and scope.

5. **All nomination materials must be bound together by a paperclip.** This includes nomination application, nomination letter, and supporting materials.
6. **One (1) copy** of the nomination application, nomination letter, and any supporting materials must be submitted to Student Activities & Greek Life **by 5:00 pm on Friday, March 2, 2018**
7. The selection committee will judge nominations using the following criteria:
 - a. Appeal to the Washburn community
 - b. Contributions to the Washburn community
 - c. Contribution to the intended audience (i.e. community service, was it an effective contribution?)
 - d. Program creativity
 - e. Program goals
 - f. Promotion of program
 - g. Student involvement in program planning
8. Each organization may nominate up to two (2) programs per category. Programs must have taken place since **April 2017**
9. The nomination letter should address the following:
 - a. Describe the program's purpose and goals as well as whether or not the goals were met
 - b. Describe the method of planning and implementing the program as well as identify what resources were used
 - c. Describe the format of the program/service
 - d. What factors contributed to the organization pursuing this program
 - e. What factors made this program successful
 - f. Describe the method of promoting the program/service to the campus community
 - g. Assess the impact and contributions the program/service had on the Washburn community
 - h. Why the program/service is deserving of this award
