## I. CALL TO ORDER

Dr. Farley called the meeting to order at 3:33 via Zoom.

## **II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

A motion was made (Barker) and seconded (Gonzalez-Abellas) to approve the minutes of the March 9, 2022 General Faculty Meeting. The minutes were approved.

## III. REMARKS

#### From the President

- Thanks for the kind words after the retirement announcement. There will be a search
  facilitated by WUBOR for a replacement. There is a very specific process that will be
  followed, including the appointment of a search committee. The intention is to have this
  completed as quickly as possible.
- The interim VPAA has been chosen, Laura Stephenson. She will be working with Mazachek to make the transition smooth.
- The Kansas Legislature and Governor have signed the education funding bill for next year. There is still the potential for a salary program. Not quite sure what that means yet, but asking WUBOR for five percent.
- Washburn has received three quarters of a million dollars for demolition on campus next year.
- Fair well to Mazachek; glad to have been able to help her move up the leadership ladder. She will be missed, we will have a hard time finding someone to do this job on a permanent basis. Stephenson will be interim only.

### From the Vice President for Academic Affairs

- Come and see her at the retirement ceremony in May so she can see everyone's faces.
- Floor to Stephenson regarding interim position
  - Honored to serve as interim VPAA; great leaders bring other great people into leadership roles. Will be working with a solid foundation at WU. There are huge shoes to fill. She will complete interim and then end her time at the university.
- Floor to Ball regarding the KBOR statewide general education plan

- A group of registrars and advisors convened to move this forward has finished their draft and sent back to committee for a vote. The draft is more restricted than our general education requirements.
- Not sure when the vote will take place, though the goal is by the end of the semester. There is an upcoming meeting during which there will likely be some discussion. Nothing will be implemented before next fall.
- Mazachek added that with the number of associate degree programs we have on campus there will likely be some hurdles to cross as the changes take place.

Mazachek noted that these will go forward for approval. The creations will go before the deletions as sometimes that is what is required to ensure the deletions can take place.
