

What's Next for Seniors?

After submitting your college application(s), you will complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA is a 2-step process.

- 1. Create your FSA ID
- Complete the FAFSA

The FAFSA enables you to apply for many types of financial aid.

- Pell Grant: Money from the government you don't have to pay it back.
 A full Pell Grant is \$7,395.
- o Student Loan: Borrowed money you must pay back.
- o Work Study: A part-time job working at the school while you take classes.

Individuals who are under 24, not married, and do not have any children, will need a parent to contribute their information to the FAFSA. (Individuals who are in foster care or have a court | ordered legal guardian, do not need to provide parent information.)

- ☐ Create your FSA ID (Federal Student Aid Identification)
- \Box Complete the 2024-2025 FAFSA, after January 1st, 2024 (2022 Federal Income Taxes need-if filed)




