


Women from every background have long realized that an uneven playing field will never bring equality or justice. Many feel the critical need to speak up and work harder for fairness in our institutions and social interactions.

# Celebrating National TRIO Day!

On February 24, 1986, a congressional resolution (H. Con. Res. 278) declared that Saturday, February 28, 1986, should be designated as "National TRIO Day" to commemorate the annual achievements of the Federal TRIO programs in communities across the country. Since then, our community has reserved the fourth Saturday in February as National TRIO Day. This day is an opportunity to focus the nation's "attention on the needs of disadvantaged young people and adults aspiring to improve their lives if they are to become contributing citizens of the country, and to the talent which will be wasted if that investment is not made."

This year the Washburn Upward Bound group celebrated it's first National TRIO Day by with a festival photo booth and gathering throughout the day. As you can see, we are lucky to have several future leaders in the program!

# National Student Leadership Congress (NSLC)




The NSLC is a competitive leadership program that selects outstanding TRIO school student delegates from Upward Bound, Upward Bound Math-Science and Talent Search programs across the United States and territories to participate in a rigorous 6day leadership experience in Washington, D.C. During the Leadership Congress, the delegates sleep, study, and dine on the campus of American University. In addition to meeting their Senators and Representatives on Capitol Hill, delegates participate in community service projects, conflict resolution workshops, and spend much of the program engaged in a Mock Congress. This requires students to research critical policy issues, draft legislation, and debate their peers with their assigned team. Washburn Upward Bound and Topeka High are honored that two of our students, Samari Ewing (pictured left) and Ju'Lyssa Juarez (pictured right), were selected to participate in this year's event. 


