Applications

With the 2024 graduation of our Upward Bound Seniors, this left several open spots for recruiting new students into the program. Recruiting 9th and 10th grade students began in September. Upward Bound currently is accepting applications! Invite your friends to apply. **Please be sure you meet the following** criteria...

- Attend or will attend Topeka High School.
- Maintain citizenship, permanent residency, or have documentation from the U.S. Immigration Office that you are in the process of applying to be a permanent resident of the United States of America.
- Meet federal guidelines based on income status or educational background of parents or legal guardian.
- Have at least a **2.5 GPA or higher** at the time of application.
- Be a high school freshman, sophomore, or junior status.
- The summer students graduating from the 8th grade may join the Upward Bound Summer Academy. Eight graders must attend the Summer Academy for 10 days before July 3, to be enrolled in the Upward Bound program.

Gather the following materials to submit:

• A copy of your parent/guardians **most recent** Tax Return Form (1040 or 1040A).

Please note, a copy of your Parent/Guardians W-2 or Tax Transcript **can not** be accepted as proof of income.

- A copy of your school transcript and 8th Grade Math and Reading/Language Arts Scores.
- **One Recommendation Form** completed by a teacher or counselor.
- If you are a 9th grader and you are applying before the end of your first semester, please submit a report card or screen shot of your online report card.

If you are a **9th grader** and **do not** have a teacher or counselor that you feel can speak to your academic abilities, you may ask a Mentor, Advisor, or other individual.

Submit an application online.

After you have submitted your application an Upward Bound Staff Member will reach out to your at the **email address you provided**. A **Student interview** is **required** to be admitted into the Upward Bound program.

Current Upward Bound Students

Contact an Upward Bound Staff member if you need a fee waiver to take the ACT or SAT or to apply for college admissions. Contact your high school counselor to register to take the ACT at THS for free, otherwise the ACT costs \$150 each time it is taken. We recommend you take it your junior year and early your senior year.



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Student Financial Aid

There are several ways to pay for a college education. One important way it to utilize free money available from the federal government. To apply for this free aid, students must submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

According to NCES, financial aid is received by 85.5% of all students pursuing higher education including college, university, or vocational school. **Current high school seniors should request a Federal Student Aid (FSA) ID by mid-October for both the student and their parent/guardian**. 8 Steps to Apply for Federal Student Aid:

- 1. Have Documentation Available (you can find what's needed **here**)
- 2. Create a Federal Student Aid Account and ID
- 3. Complete the Online FAFSA
- 4. List Codes of Colleges and Universities the student is applying to
- 5. Review, Sign, and Submit the FAFSA application
- 6. Receive the Student Aid Report (SAR)

7. Provide additional documentation as necessary8. Receive, Review, and Accept Financial AidOffers

College Scholarships

Everyone in grades 9 through 12, now is the time to research and begin applying for college scholarships. Create a scholarship and admissions tracking document to keep track of where you want to attend college and what scholarships you have applied for. There are need-based and merit-based scholarships available. Often they are essay based and your Upward Bound Advisor and tutors can help edit your essay. When it's time to apply for college, you can ask your college Admissions staff for tips on where to find scholarships unique to your college of interest. One tip to help keep track is opening an email account you only use when applying for scholarships or applying to colleges. This will help give you one place to check when you finalized your college application list and plan your campus visits. Check out Google classroom for upcoming scholarship opportunities. Right now the VFW has an essay scholarship worth up to \$35,000 and it's open to 9th graders through 12th graders with an October 31st deadline. Visit Google classroom for more scholarship information.

Grants are funds you do not have to pay back. Most grants come from state or federal aid and are determined by your FAFSA application. The maximum Pell Grant award for the 2024-2025 school year is \$7,395. Check studentaid.gov for updates on Pell Grant awards.

Federal Work Study (FWS) provides part time jobs for college students and is based on need. It allows you to earn money to help pay for educational expenses while you are a college student. Students must sign the agreement to accept Federal Work Study as part of your financial aid package. Grasping key concepts of Financial literacy is a crucial piece of college readiness puzzle. Familiarize yourself with financial aid terms and processes as you seek out scholarships or grants that can offset the cost of tuition. Stay informed about deadlines and requirements to maximize your opportunities for receiving financial aid. Remember to ask for help and visit your college's financial aid office on campus. Building financial literacy takes time, so be proactive in educating yourself and improving your understanding of personal finance. Developing good habits now will have a positive impact your finances in the future.

All high school students in grades 9 -12 can apply by writing an essay using the VFW Scholarship theme: "Is America Today Our Forefathers' Vision?" Several essay scholarships are awarded ranging from \$1000 to \$35,000. Before submitting your essay, download the <u>2024-2025 entry</u> <u>form here</u> and find your sponsoring <u>local VFW Post</u> as applications must be turned in to our local VFW post by midnight, Oct. 31, 2024.

TRIO Turns 60!



Federal TRIO programs have been helping students across the country get into college, succeed in college, graduate and get an awesome career since 1965, when it was established by Congress. The word TRIO refers to the first three federal programs being Upward Bound, Talent Search, and Student Support Services. Now the TRIO program has expanded to eight but has kept the TRIO name. All eight programs include Educational Opportunity Centers, Ronald E. McNair Postbaccalaureate Achievement, Student Support Services, Talent Search, Training Program for Federal TRIO Programs Staff, Upward Bound, Upward Bound Math and Science, and Veterans Upward Bound. TRIO has been working with students like you for decades to reach your dreams while making lifetime friends and lasting connections with mentors.

All 8 TRIO programs are designed with student transformation in mind emphasizing building career and life skills in an inspiring environment with caring people to lead the way. Happy 60th birthday TRIO!

2025 Summer Bridge

All Upward Bound seniors interested in attending the 2025 Summer Bridge must apply for the **2024-2025** and the **2025-2026 FAFSA** by **December 15th.** Upward Bound can help you and your family apply for FAFSA, reach out to Zalma to make an appointment. Summer Bridge students attend Washburn University the summer after high school graduation, live on campus in the residence halls including their meals free of charge, and receive **6 free college credits.** Students must apply for the Bridge program, it is not something guaranteed to all Upward Bound students. Bridge costs around \$10,000 per student and we currently have 5 spots available for Summer 2025. Applications for Summer Bridge will be available in January 2025 for those who applied to the FAFSA in December 2024.




