In addition to meeting requirements for the WU Certificate in Addiction Counseling, the following 11 courses (33 credit hours) meet Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board (BSRB) educational requirements for becoming a Licensed Addiction Counselor (LAC) in the state of Kansas. Students must also have a Bachelor's degree in a helping-related profession (CJ is included) and must pass the BSRB licensing exam to become a LAC.

To be awarded the certificate, a student must have a Bachelor's degree or receive the degree concurrently with the certificate.

First Internship CJ 480 or 490 Intern in Corrections/Law Enforcement (sub for HS 280) Placement must be pre-approved by HS and CJ Depts. Supervisor must have BSRB clinical license. Students must log 200 clock hours in addiction treatment activities and receive one hour of supervision for every 10 hours of internship. Signed hours/supervision logs must be submitted to HS department at completion of internship.	
Second Internship HS380 (200 clock hours) Student must apply and be accepted to HS internship program by October 1st for spring internships and March 1st for fall internships. Application materials are on HS website.
