Aleshire Center Scholarship Eligibility Criteria

Direct from high school students must have a GPA at least 2.75 on 4.0 scale. College transfer students must have a cumulative college GPA of 2.75.

Scholarship Participation Requirements

Accepting a scholarship from the Aleshire Center for Leadership & Community Engagement is more than just an award-based scholarship. Annual renewal of the scholarship is contingent upon maintaining a GPA requirement, making appropriate annual progress toward a minor or certificate in Leadership Studies or Community Studies, and participating in one of the core co-curricular programs, Leaders of Tomorrow or Bonner Leaders.

What items to submit.

All items must be received to complete your application to be considered for an Aleshire Center scholarship.

1. Essay – Submit a typed essay responding to **ONE of the Essay Options** below. Thoroughly and well-written responses are more important than length of responses (approximately 500 words). Provide support of your ideas by using personal examples throughout the essay.

Essay Option 1: Explain a defining moment in your life. Defining moments can be positive or negative, but help you rethink your values, future actions and your confidence. After explaining the defining moment, please share how this moment shaped your future behaviors.

Essay Option 2: Explain what responsibility you believe leaders have to the greater community. Discuss any community involvement you have and how you demonstrated leadership through those experiences.

Essay Option 3: Reflect on a meaningful leadership experience you've had. Describe the challenges you faced, the actions you took, and the outcomes of your leadership. How did this experience influence your understanding of effective leadership and how will you apply these lessons in future leadership roles.?

2. Resume – your resume should highlight the following areas:

* Leadership Roles * Honors & Awards Received * Community Engagement & Service * Work Experience
(Remember to include organizational activities, leadership positions, events you participated in etc. If you don't write it down, we won't know about it.)

3. One letter of Recommendation – The letter of recommendation should be a direct observation of leadership you have shown and include any community engagement or service activities. It should be forwarded to the Aleshire Center prior to or postmarked by February 28, 2025.

Where to submit items.

- 1. Scholarship Application**
- 2. Personal Resume highlighting your leadership and community engagement accomplishments**
- 3. Typed essay answering one of the three questions**
- 4. One letter of recommendation**

(Applications and supporting documents postmarked later than **February 28, 2025**, cannot be guaranteed a review. Even if we can review late submissions, they will almost certainly be at a competitive disadvantage in the review process.)
