Lolley, co-leader of the study abroad program to Haiti (Haiti Life Line) presented in response to the State Department Travel warning to Haiti, and answered questions about the safety measures and local resources to ensure safety and security of the participants. Zhang reported that international student enrollment was down this fall. Main factors include a sharp decrease in applicants from China, Saudi government scholarship cuts, and high visa rejection rate (70%) in Nepal.

Kowalski reported that the Law School's new study abroad program in Osaka, Japan, led by Craig Martin, had a successful year.

Kwak's "Korean Language, Culture, and Economics" program proposal was approved as a WTE program.
