TITLE: Exercise and Rehabilitation Science Majors Club

TITLE: World AIDS Day and World AIDS Month  
ORIGINATOR: Vice-Chairperson Nelson  
SPONSOR: Trautman/Babcock Administration  
STATUS: Communications Committee - Pending

WHEREAS: December 1<sup>st</sup> is recognized as World AIDS Day, and

WHEREAS: The month of December is recognized as World AIDS Month, and

WHEREAS: According to the most recent available statistics from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), 47,800 Americans ages 13-24, which includes traditional-aged college students, had HIV, the disease which causes AIDS, and

WHEREAS: According to HIV.gov, 1 in 8 Americans who have HIV don't know they have it, and

WHEREAS: 2021 marks the fortieth anniversary of the start of the AIDS pandemic in the U.S., and

WHEREAS: More than 700,000 Americans have died from HIV/AIDS since the beginning of the pandemic, and

WHEREAS: Those with HIV/AIDS face stigma and discrimination, both in the U.S. and globally, and such stigma can discourage those with HIV/AIDS from seeking prevention tools and testing and talking openly with partners about safer sex options, and

WHEREAS: According to HIV.gov, 8 in 10 adults with HIV in the U.S. reported feeling internalized HIV-related stigma, which can include feelings of depression, isolation, and shame, and

WHEREAS: Student Health Services at Washburn University provides services for the treatment and prevention of sexually transmitted infections such as HIV, including providing HIV testing, free condoms, educational events about safer sex, and prescriptions for pre-exposure and post-exposure prophylaxis for HIV (medications used to prevent HIV transmission).

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

SECTION ONE: Washburn Student Government Association mourns those lives lost to HIV/AIDS.

SECTION TWO: Washburn Student Government Association recognizes that HIV/AIDS remains an active pandemic.

SECTION THREE: Washburn Student Government Association encourages the end of stigma towards those with HIV/AIDS.

SECTION FOUR: Washburn Student Government Association encourages students at Washburn University to take steps to prevent the transmission of HIV/AIDS, such as getting tested for HIV/AIDS and wearing condoms.

SECTION FIVE: This legislation shall become effective upon passage.
